1. All entry forms together with the entry fees must be sent to **Rebekah Williams**, Oak Cottage, Llyswen, Brecon, LD3 0YA, email: becka-williams@hotmail.co.uk no later than **Monday 12th August 2024**.
2. Anyone donating a fee of £15 (single) or £25 (double) shall be entitled to be a Vice-President with free entry to the field and in all classes of the Show, on production of a Vice President's badge.
3. All marquee exhibits to be staged by **11:00 am** on the morning of the Show.
4. Exhibitors are required to sign the declaration on the Entry Form
5. Any class with a specified age refers to age on Show Day, unless otherwise specified.
6. The Committee reserve to themselves the right to inspect the Exhibitor's gardens and farms after entries have been made.
7. Objections to any exhibit must be made in writing to the Chairman before 15:00 on the day of the Show, together with the sum of £5 which will be forfeited if the objection is not sustained.
8. No exhibit to be removed before **17:00**
9. The Committee will not be responsible for any damage or loss that may occur or for any accident or injuries to persons, property or stock however caused.
10. All classes are open except those identified as Local, i.e. confined to the Parishes of Llyswen, Boughrood, Glasbury, Llandefalle, Pipton and Llanstephan.
11. Entries for all Local Agricultural Classes are judged from the 3rd week in June onwards at the Judges discretion.
12. The Judges decision in all cases is final.
13. Points awarded for Trophies are: 1st - 4 ; 2nd - 2 ; 3rd – 1
14. Any trophies awarded must be signed for and may not be collected prior to the official presentation.
The Winners of all Trophies must return them in good condition to the Secretary by 30th June each year.
15. All honey entries for the Brecknock & Radnor Beekeepers' Association must be sent to Chris Cardew (Address: Pentwyn, Tredustan, Brecon, LD3 0PY Mob: 07944 722999)
16. Winners to collect prize money on the day from the marquee, from 4pm.

16. **In line with Bio-Security regulations, no entries for Sheep and Cattle can be taken on the field.** Entries must be sent to the **Sheep and Cattle Secretaries** not later than **Monday 12th August 2024**
ALL Pony entries will be taken on the field. All stock is to be on the field 30 minutes prior to judging.
17. All stock to be Exhibitor's property for at least 3 months prior to the Show.
18. Any animal, which in the opinion of the Stewards, is acting dangerously, may be required to be removed from the ring.
19. Exhibitors are responsible for acquainting themselves with the DEFRA and WAG regulations and compliance therewith.
20. **All Exhibitors to comply with the BIO Security regulations and Animal Gatherings Order for 2024**



Honey Fruit Cake Recipe

227g/8oz self-raising flour, 115g/4oz sultanas, 115g/4oz butter/margarine or mixed, 227g/8oz Welsh honey, 115g/4oz currants, pinch of salt, 57g/2oz mixed peel, 2 large eggs (size 1)

Cream butter/margarine and honey. Beat eggs well and add them alternately with the sifted flour, but save a little flour to add with the fruit. Beat all together, lightly. A little milk may be added (up to 3 tablespoons) if necessary. Fold in the fruit and stir well. Bake in a well-buttered tin for 32approx.. 1-1¼ hours (or until just firm to touch) in a moderate oven (32approx.. 325 F/160C/Gas 3). Round cake tin approximately 18cm/7 inches.

Honey Fudge Recipe

115g butter, 450g granulated sugar, 1 (397g) tin condensed milk, 2 tablespoons honey, 140ml milk, A pinch of cream of tartar.

Line or grease an 18cm (7 inch) square tin. Heat all the ingredients together slowly until sugar has completely dissolved. Bring to the boil, stirring all the time, until it reaches 114 C or 240 F on a sugar thermometer. Remove from heat and continue to beat until it thickens. Pour into tin. When it has cooled slightly, mark into squares. Set aside to cool completely.

Oaty Honey Biscuits Recipe (makes 12 biscuits)

75g self-raising flour, 75g porridge / rolled oats, 75g caster sugar, 75g butter, 1 tablespoon honey, 1 tablespoon milk.

Preheat the oven to 180 C / Gas 4 and place parchment on a baking tray. Sift the flour into a bowl and then add the oats and sugar. In a saucepan melt the butter, milk and honey together till it is a liquid and then add it to your flour mixture and mix together. Form into biscuit shapes (makes around 12) and place in oven for around 10 to 15 minutes or till slightly brown.
